Update on the redesign of Auckland Airport's international departure area

Every day you notice something different when you step into the landside departure area at our international terminal. It's amazing just how quickly stores can be up and running, and the floor is taking on a shiny new look as smart tiles creep across the space. The area is being transformed to make way for a more modern and inviting space. Over the next 18 months, travellers and visitors will witness the area take shape, virtually before their eyes, as the departures level is completely rejuvenated.

So what's been happening?

All the activity continues in the landside departure area of the international terminal.

- Tank Juice has relocated to the new food court, as has McDonald's, creating a wonderful hub of food options for travellers, their friends and family.
- Rip Curl has some new neighbours, Travelex on one side, with the smart new Great New Zealand Shop on the other.
- One of the BNZ ATM's has moved to the top of the escalators, next to Whitcoulls. The NZ Post Box is also located here.
- A new Atomic Cafe is being built in the food court area, where the bar was, and once complete Cafe Espresso will close down.
- Two skylights have now opened casting natural light into the area. The team is now working on the next skylight; in all there will be five skylights stretching the length of the space. If you look up you will notice structures suspended from the skylights which cast interesting shapes onto the floor.
- The shiny new floor continues to unfold.
- More hoardings will be erected in preparation for the construction of the new emigration processing area.
- The first shipment of new tables for the foodcourt will be arriving later this month.

PS. What's happening in the arrivals duty free store?

- You may have noticed hoardings being erected in the DFS Galleria arrivals duty free store. This space is being reconfigured to make space for new duty free retailer JR Duty Free. DFS will finish their consolidation work in August and then JR will begin their fit out, expected to be complete by Oct 09.
