

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY 2011

Company Policy

As the operator of New Zealand's largest international airport, the key gateway into New Zealand, Auckland Airport is acutely aware of the need to manage environmental risk. Auckland Airport is located on the very edge of the Manukau Harbour. It is a unique site that includes sensitive natural environments, rich local heritage and culture, but is also close to residential communities.

In order to manage the environmental risks, associated with its operations, Auckland Airport shall:

- Conduct its operations in compliance with all applicable environmental legislation, plans, standards and codes of practice.
- Strive to achieve best practice in environmental management relative to other international airports.
- Prevent pollution by identifying, controlling and minimising adverse environmental impacts.
- Protect and, wherever possible, enhance habitats and their associated wildlife, without compromising aircraft safety.
- Encourage a commitment to the environment from all stakeholders, including; employees, tenants, customers and the local community.
- Maintain a documented management system that includes; the setting of objectives and targets, training, audit, management review and the requirement for continual improvement.
- Report its performance to interested stakeholders on a regular basis.
